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### About this Report::

This report summarizes fall enrollment for Wayne State University. This report uses data from the university's fall census as compiled by the Office of Budget, Planning and Analysis.

## Definitions

**Credit Hour**—A credit hour is defined as one class hour per week or its equivalent.

**First Time in Any College (FTIAC)** - A full- time or part- time student attending any institution for the first time. Includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended a postsecondary institution for the first time at the same level in the prior summer term. Also includes students who entered with advanced standing (college credit earned before graduation from high school).

**Full Time Student (Fall/Winter Semester):** A student at the following level must be enrolled in the following amount of credit hours per term, regardless of the level of the course: Undergraduate, 12 or more credit hours; Graduate, 8 or more credit hours; Professional (excluding Medical students), 10 or more credit hours.

**Full Time Equivalent (FTE) Students (using fall student headcounts):** The number of FTE students is a calculation based on fall student headcounts as reported to IPEDS. The FTE for part time students is calculated by multiplying the part time headcount by a factor determined by student level and added to the full time student headcount to achieve a full time equivalent headcount.

**Graduate Student**—A student who holds a bachelor's or first professional degree, or equivalent, and is enrolled in a graduate program.

**Headcount (Enrollment)**—Number of students enrolled at the institution as of census date of the term, the tenth day of classes. Each student equals one headcount, regardless of the credit hours taken.

**Non-Resident Student**—A student with a legal residence outside of Michigan.

**Professional student**-- A student enrolled in either the Medical Doctor program, Doctor of Pharmacy program, or Juris Doctor program.

**Resident Student**—A student having a legal residence in Michigan.

**Transfer Student**—A student entering the reporting institution for the first time but known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the same level, e.g. undergraduate, graduate and has earned credit at that institution.

**Undergraduate student**—A student enrolled in a bachelor's degree program or post-bachelor certificate program; includes non-degree-seeking students who do not have a bachelor's degree.

## Executive Summary of Changes From Fall 2012 to Fall 2013

- Headcount enrollment change
  - Total headcount decreased by 1,041 students (-3.6%).
  - Undergraduate headcount decreased by 740 students (-3.8%).
  - Graduate level headcount decreased by 272 students (-3.6%).
  - Professional level headcount decreased by 29 students (-1.4%).
- Credit hour enrollment change
  - Total credit hours decreased by 9,348 credits (-3.0%).
  - Undergraduate credit hours decreased by 7,619 credits (-3.5%).
  - Graduate level credit hours decreased by 1,078.5 credits (-2.1%).
  - Professional level credit hours decreased by 650.5 credits (-1.6%).
- First Time in Any College (FTIAC) undergraduate headcount decreased by 170 (-7.3%) students and 2,181 (-6.9%) credit hours.
- Transfer undergraduate enrollment headcount decreased by 283 (-13.1%) and 3,074 credit hours (-12.6%).
- Minority total enrollment headcount decreased 412 (-4.4%).
- Total international enrollment headcount increased by 246 students (15.1%).
- The average ACT composite score for incoming FTIACs was 22.8 and high school grade point was 3.22.
- The full-time FTIAC (degree-seeking) one year retention (freshman returning a second year) increased from 75% to 77%.
- The four-year graduation rate was 11% for the fall 2009 cohort.
- The five-year graduation rate was 23% for the fall 2008 cohort.
- The six-year graduation rate was 32% for the fall 2007 cohort.

## Total Fall Enrollment

The fall 2013 total enrollment headcount decreased from the fall 2012 count of 28,938. This represents a decline of 3.6 percent. Total credit hours decreased by 9,345 or 3.0 percent.

Ninety percent of Wayne State students were Michigan residents. Eighty percent of WSU's students came from the Wayne, Oakland and Macomb county areas. Since 2006, the demographic for student residency has remained approximately 90 percent for Michigan residents.

The portion of students that are full-time has increased three percentage points in the past five years. The average credit hour load for undergraduates is 11.3, graduate students 7.0, Law students 12.8, Medical students 23.8, and Pharmacy students 13.5.

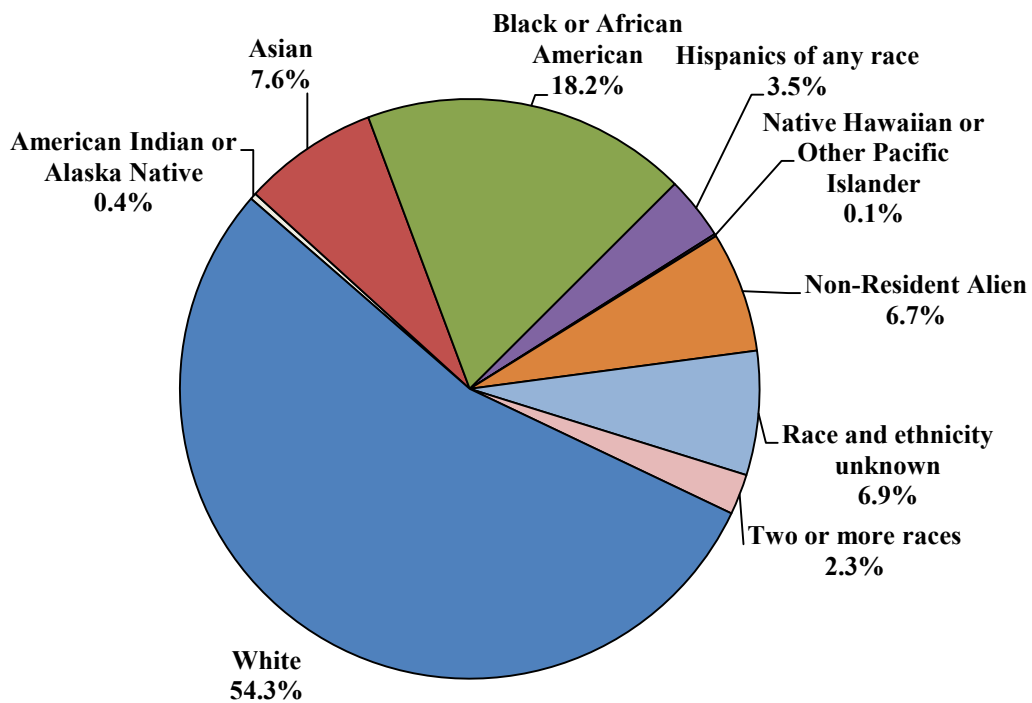

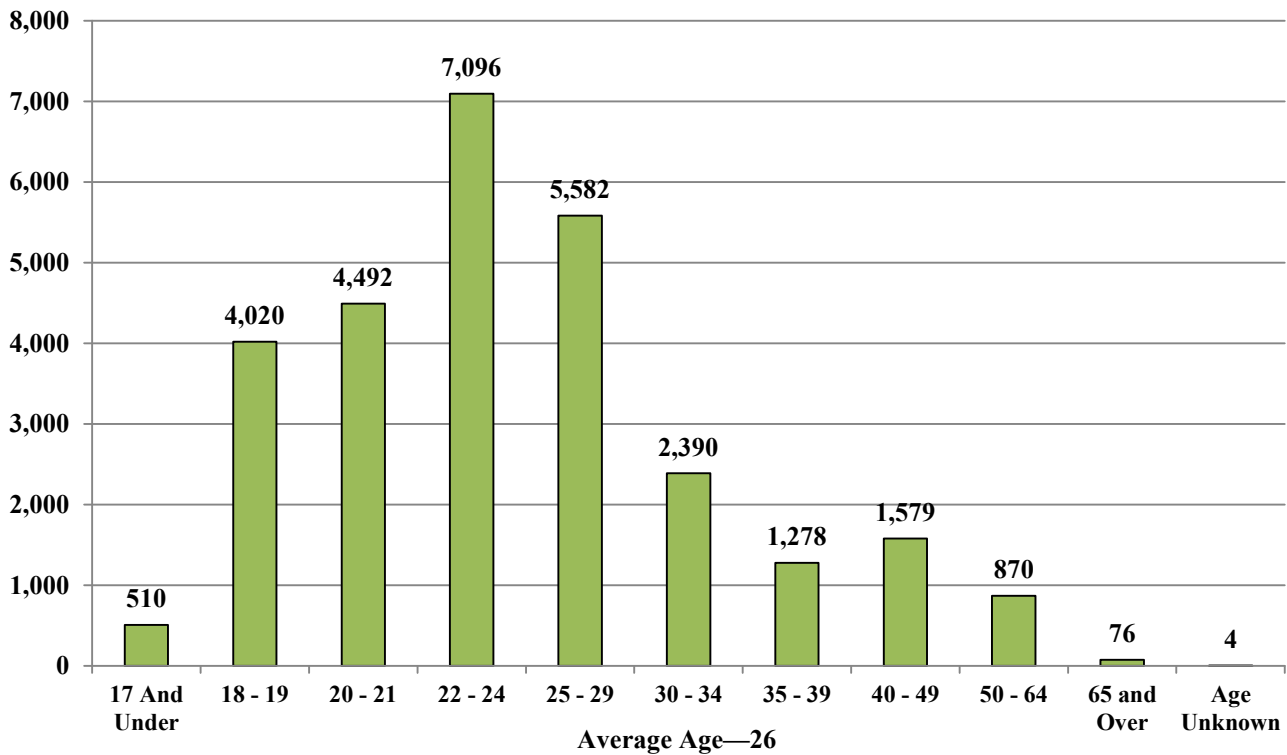

### Fall 2013 Total Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity



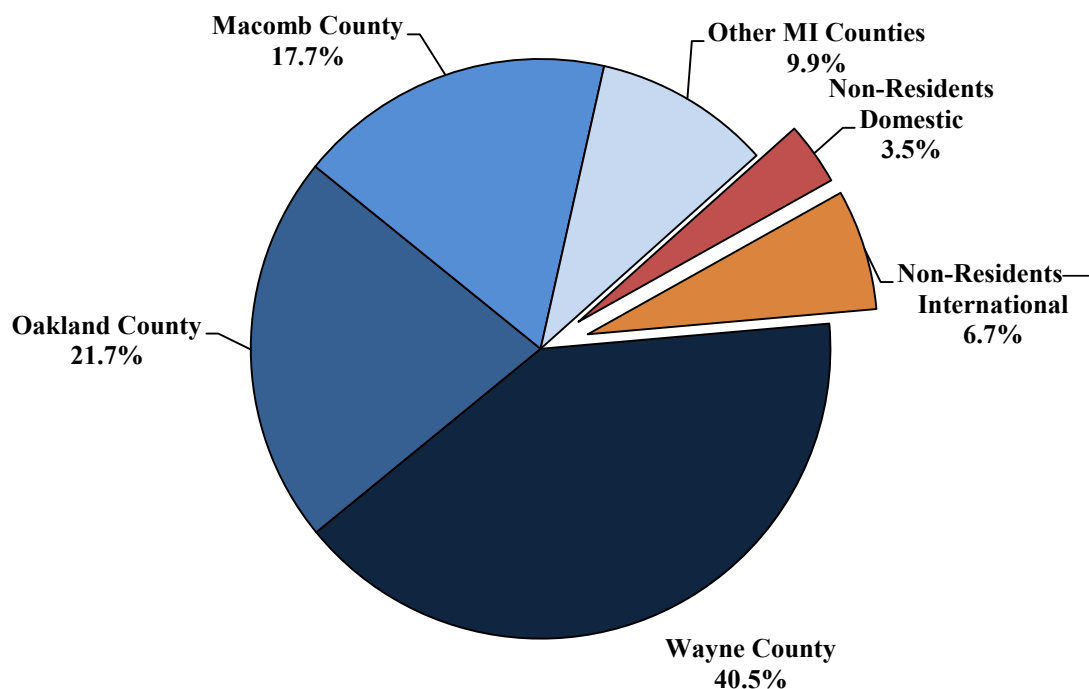
### Fall 2013 Total Enrollment by Age

### Fall 2013 Total Enrollment by Geographic Origin

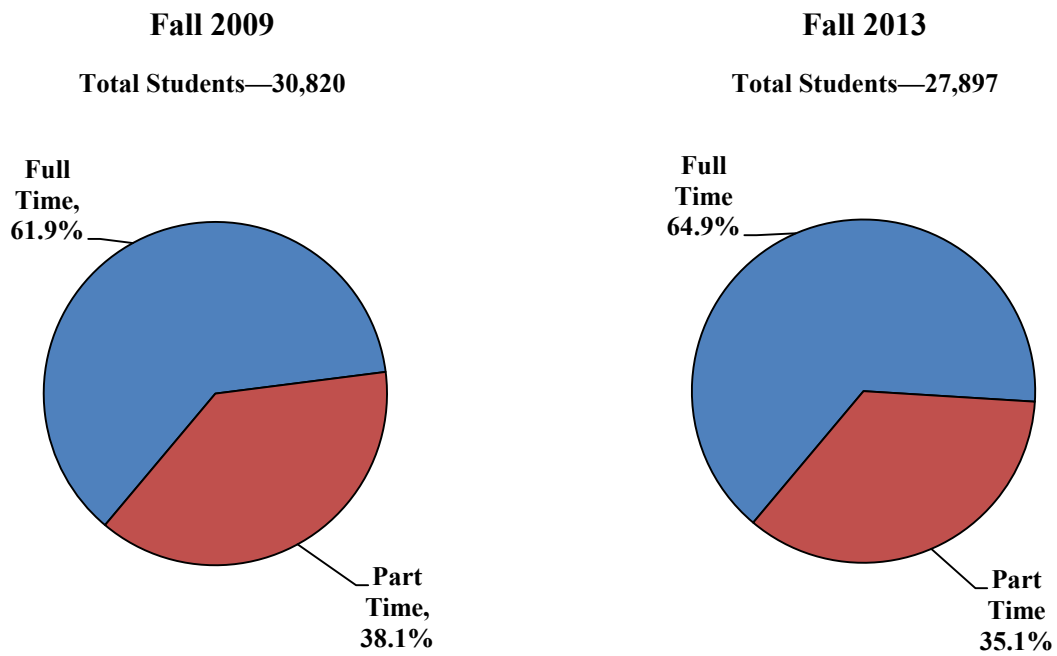

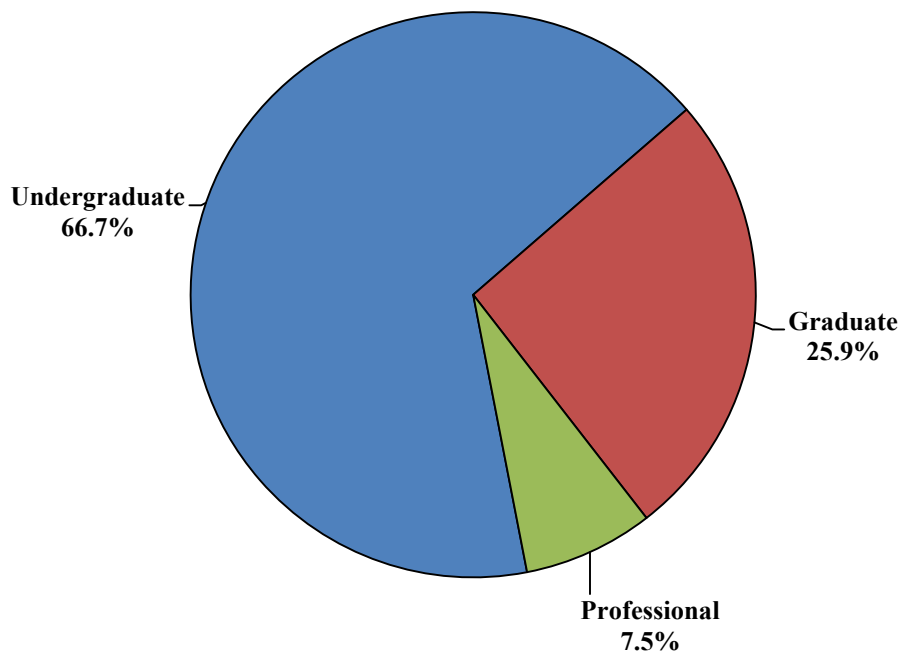

## Undergraduate Fall Enrollment

The undergraduate fall enrollment headcount and credit hour totals declined since fall 2012, including: FTIAC, transfers, and continuing undergraduate students.

The fall 2013 average undergraduate credit hour load remained the same as fall 2012 at 11.3.

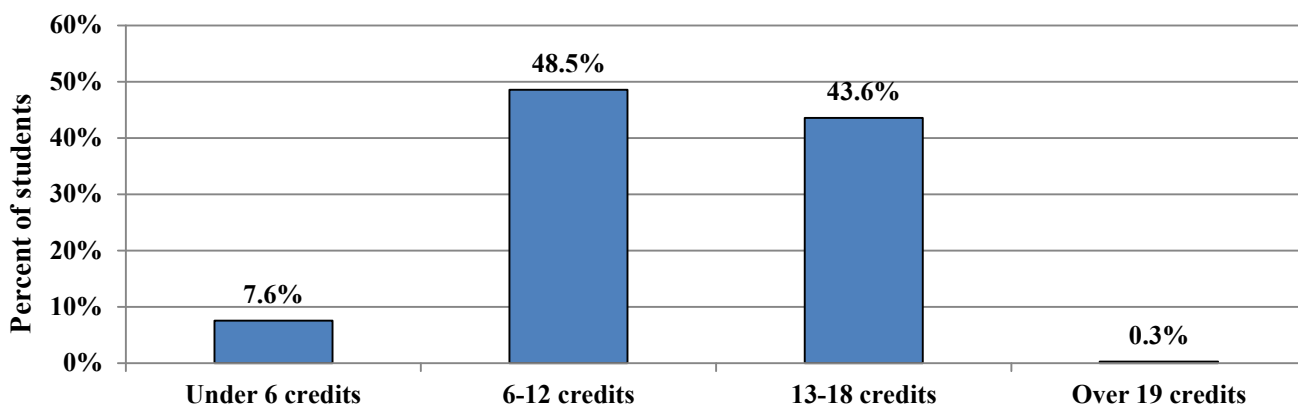

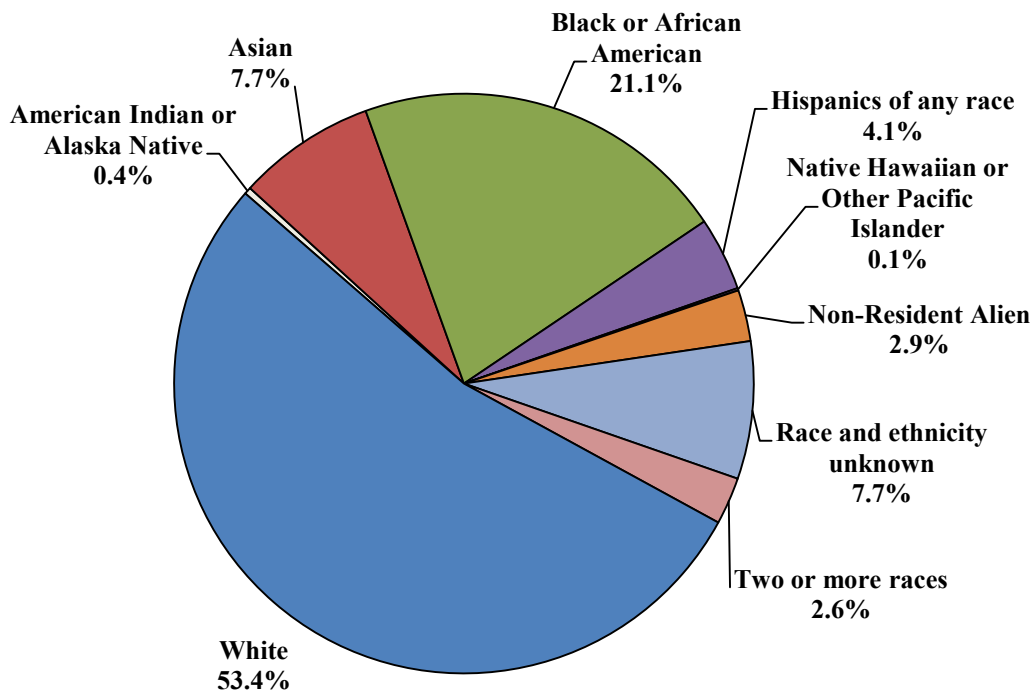

### Fall 2013 Undergraduate Student Credit Hour Load Distribution

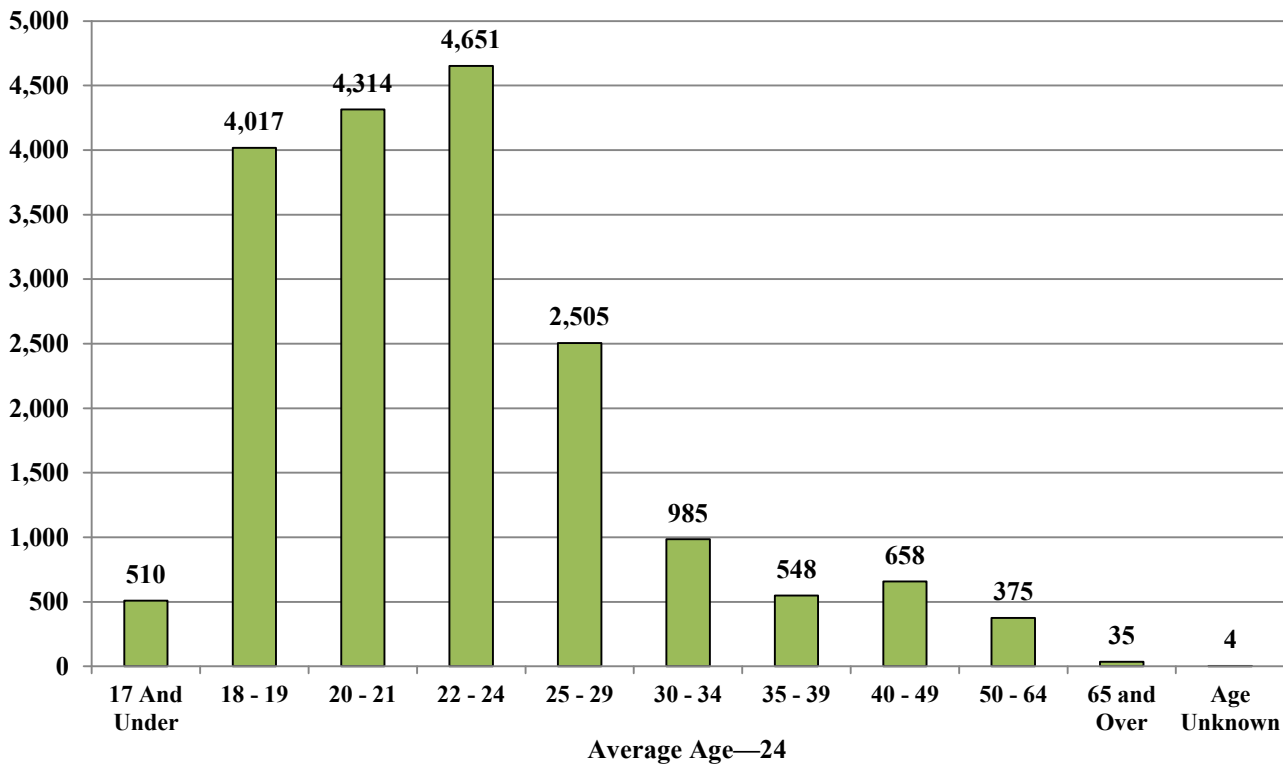

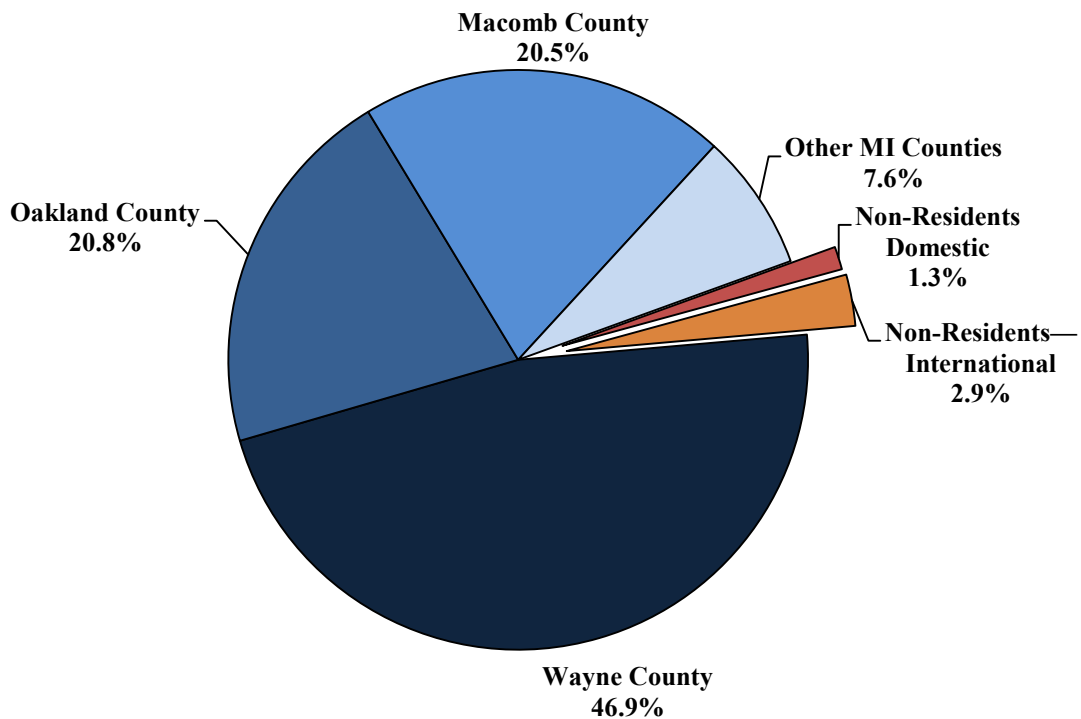
### Fall 2013 Undergraduate Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

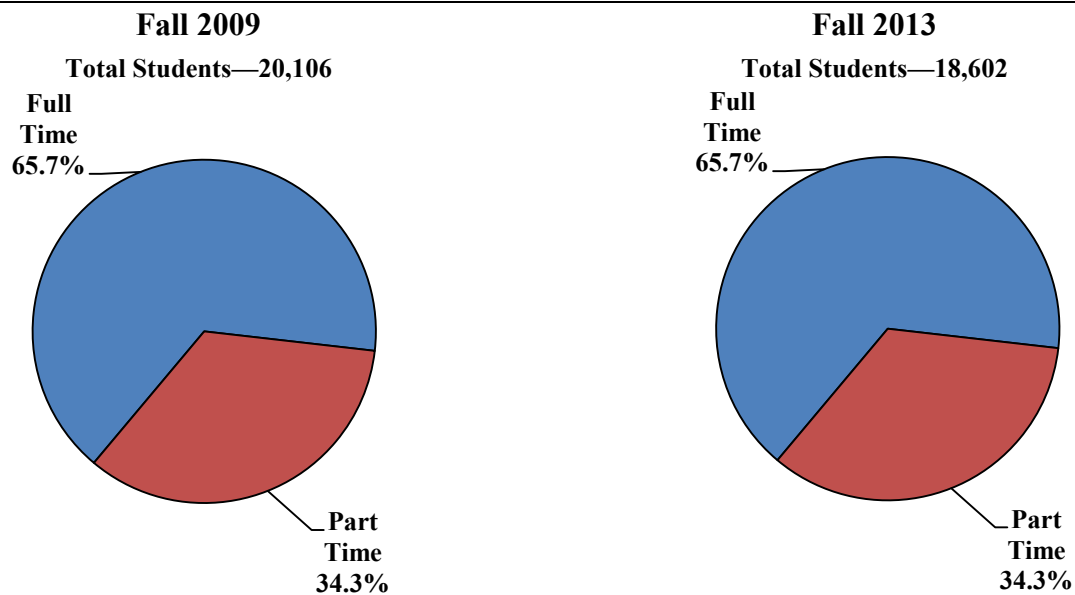

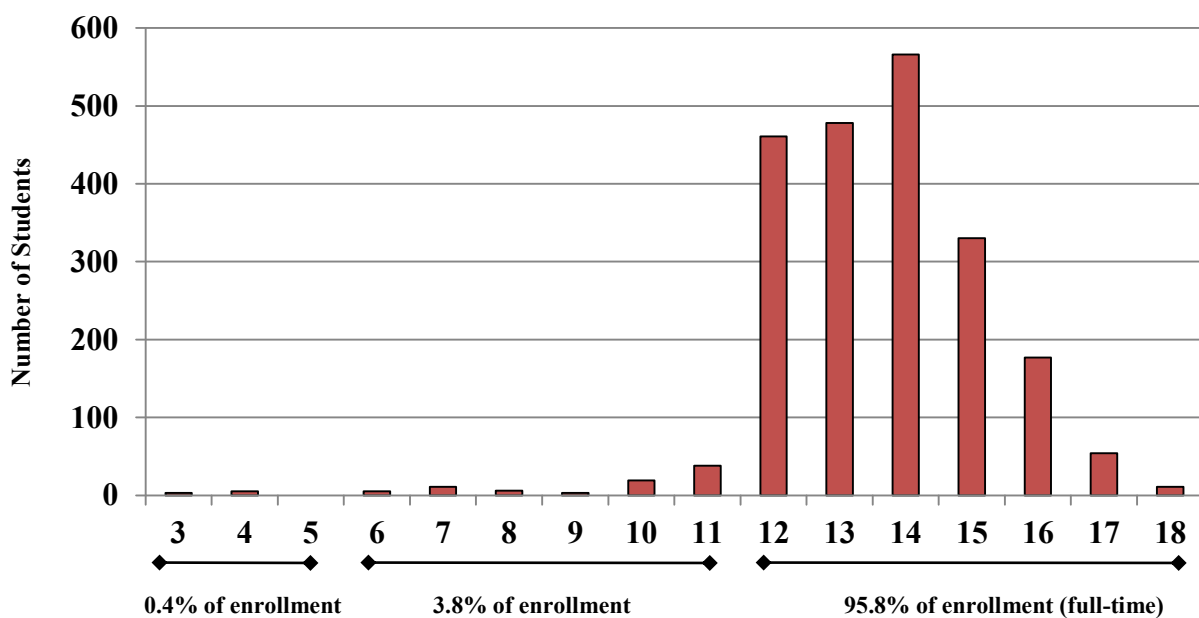

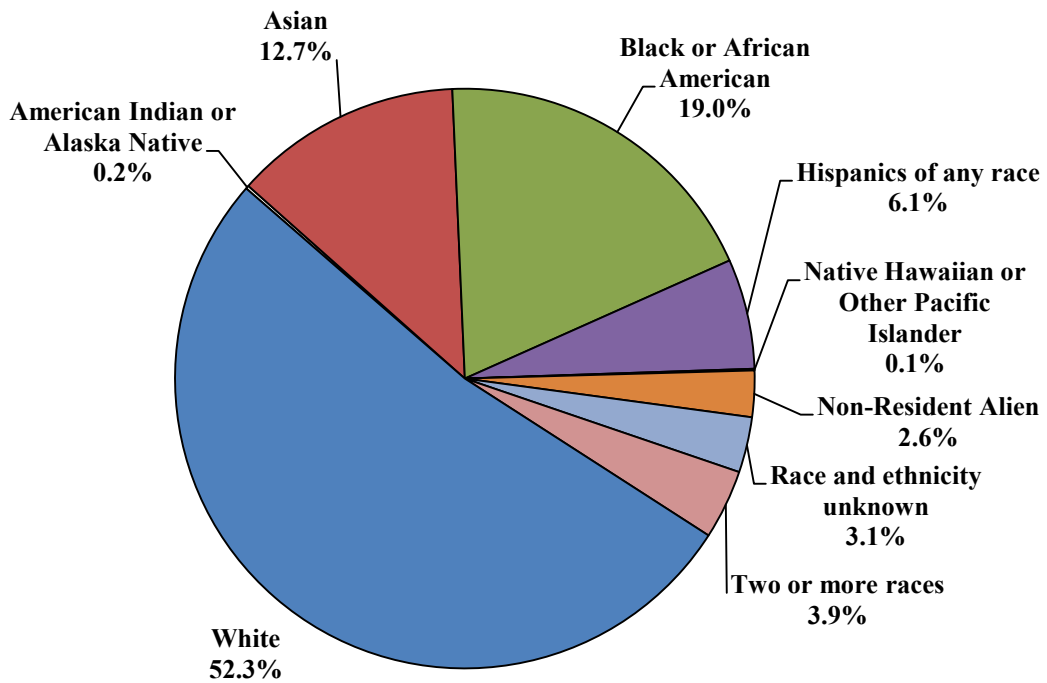
### Fall 2013 FTIAC Student Credit Hour Load Distribution



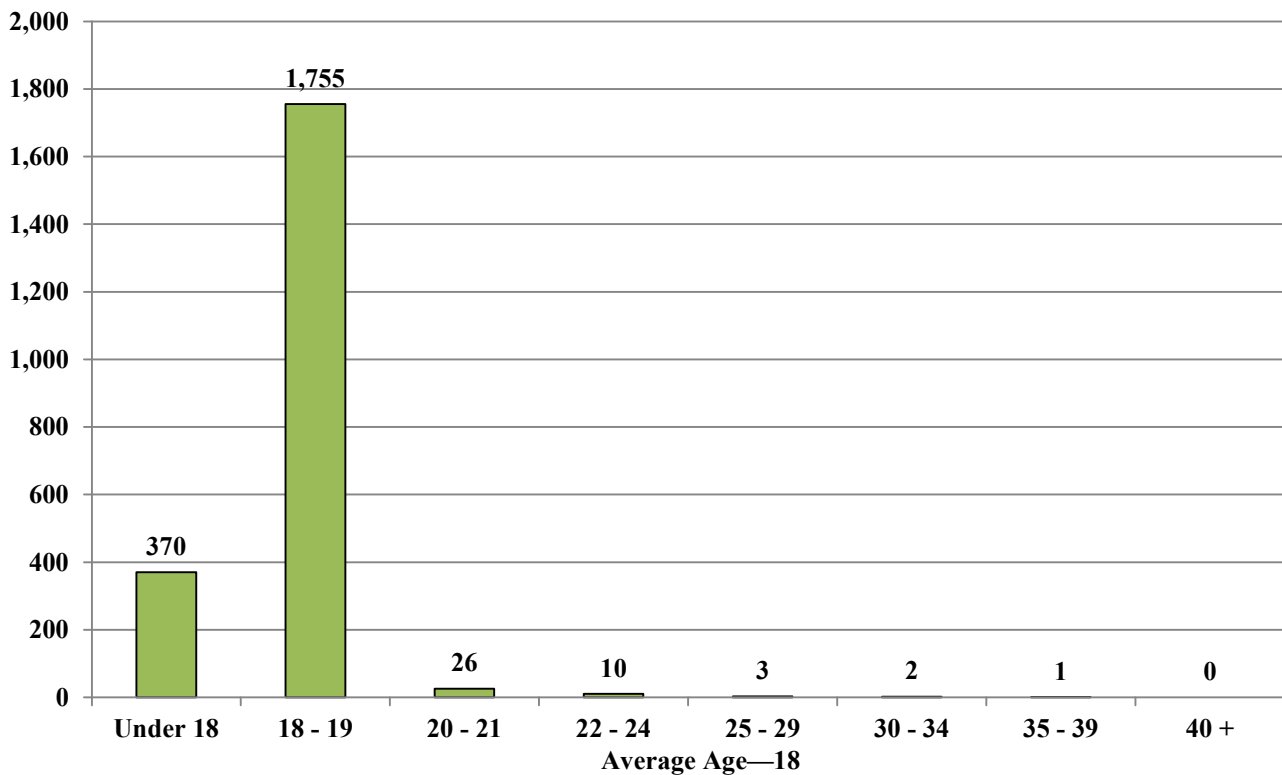

### Fall 2013 FTIAC Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

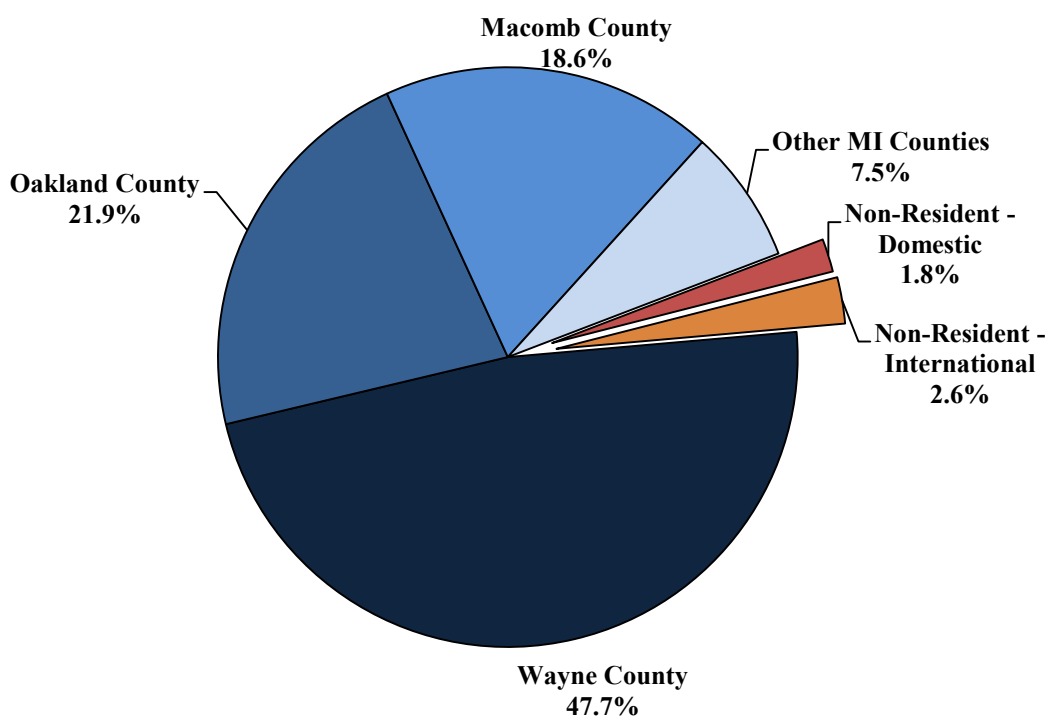


### Fall 2013 FTIAC Enrollment by Age



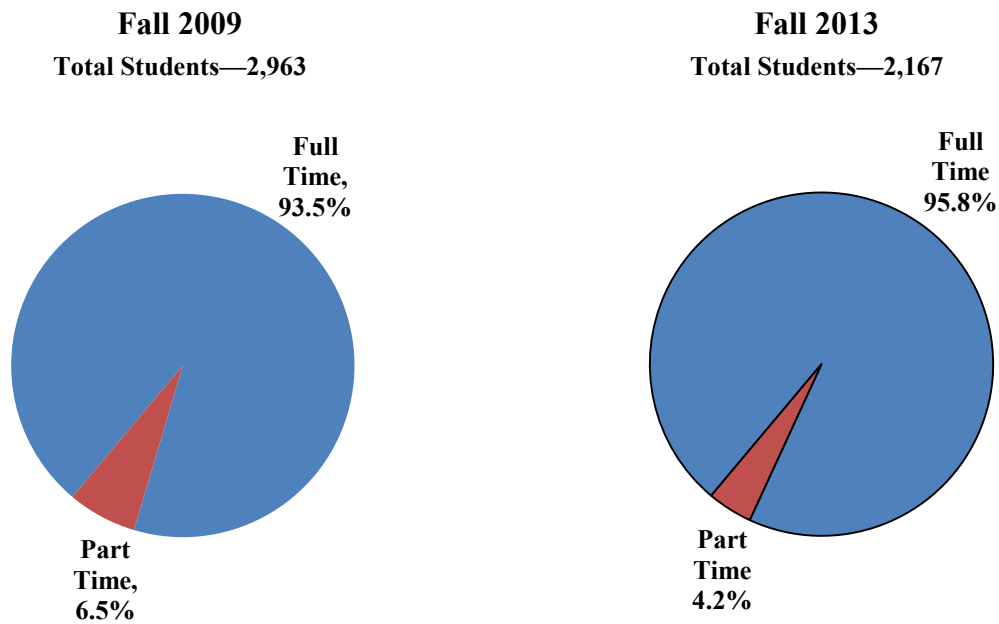


### Fall 2013 FTIAC Enrollment by Geographic Origin



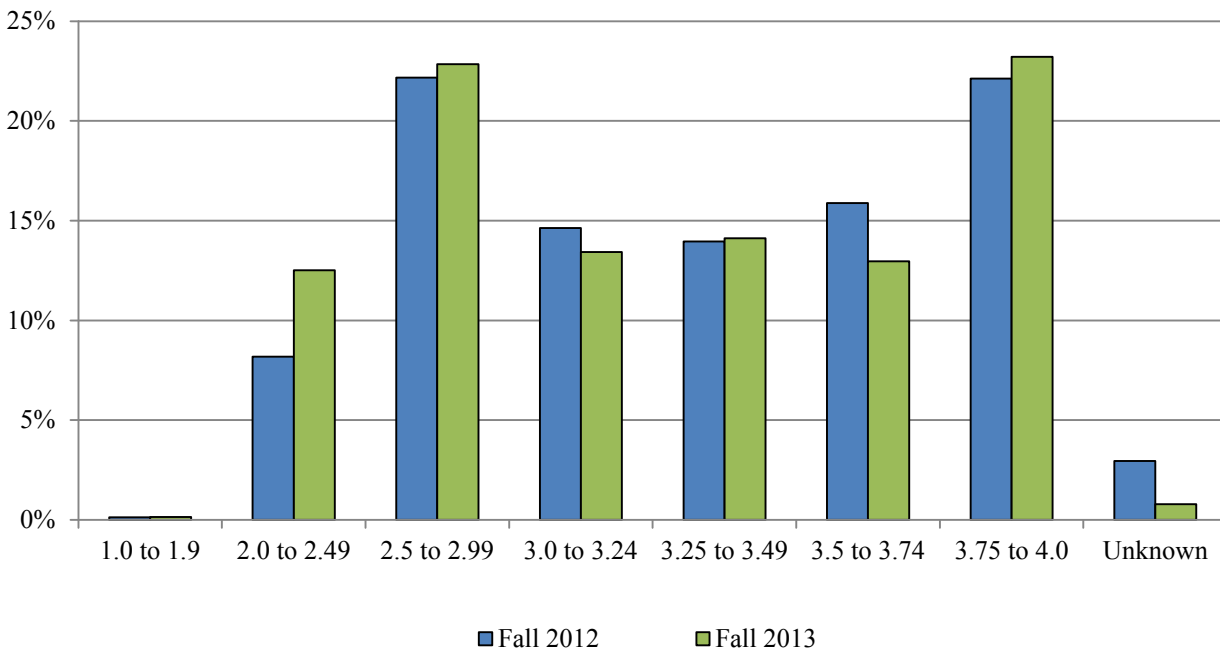

### Fall 2009 to Fall 2013 FTIAC Enrollment by Time Status Comparison

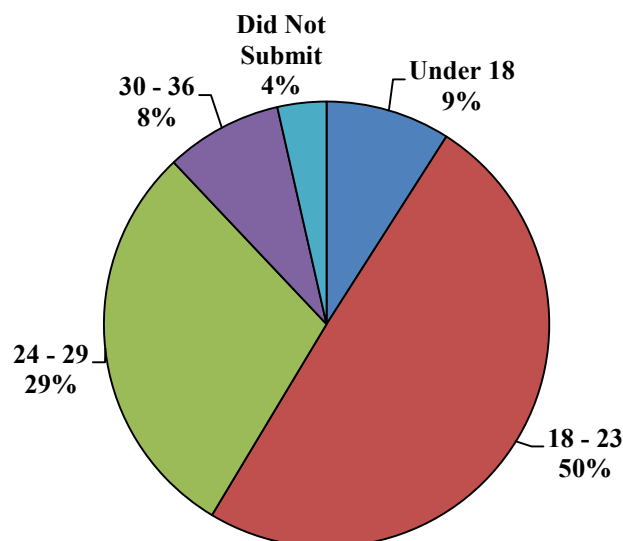


### Fall 2013 FTIAC High School Grade Point Average

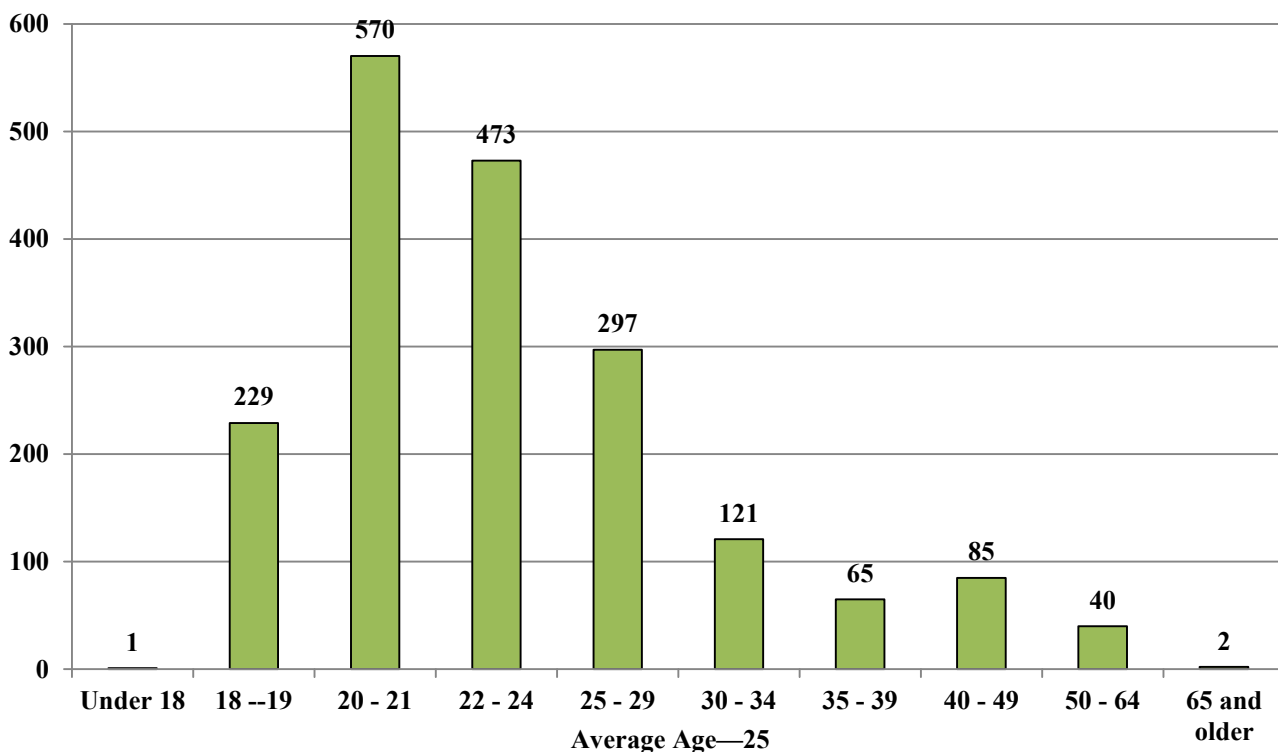

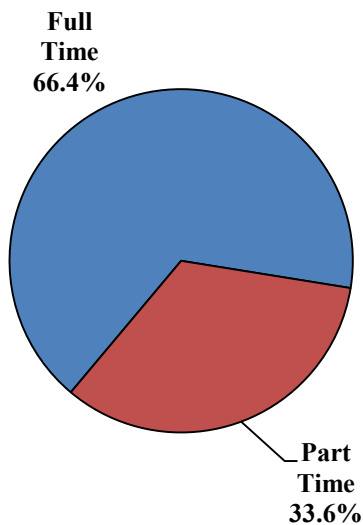
### Fall 2013 Transfer Enrollment by Age



### Fall 2009 to 2013 Transfer Enrollment by Time Status Comparison

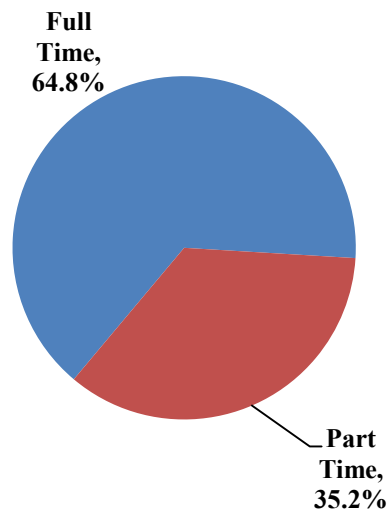

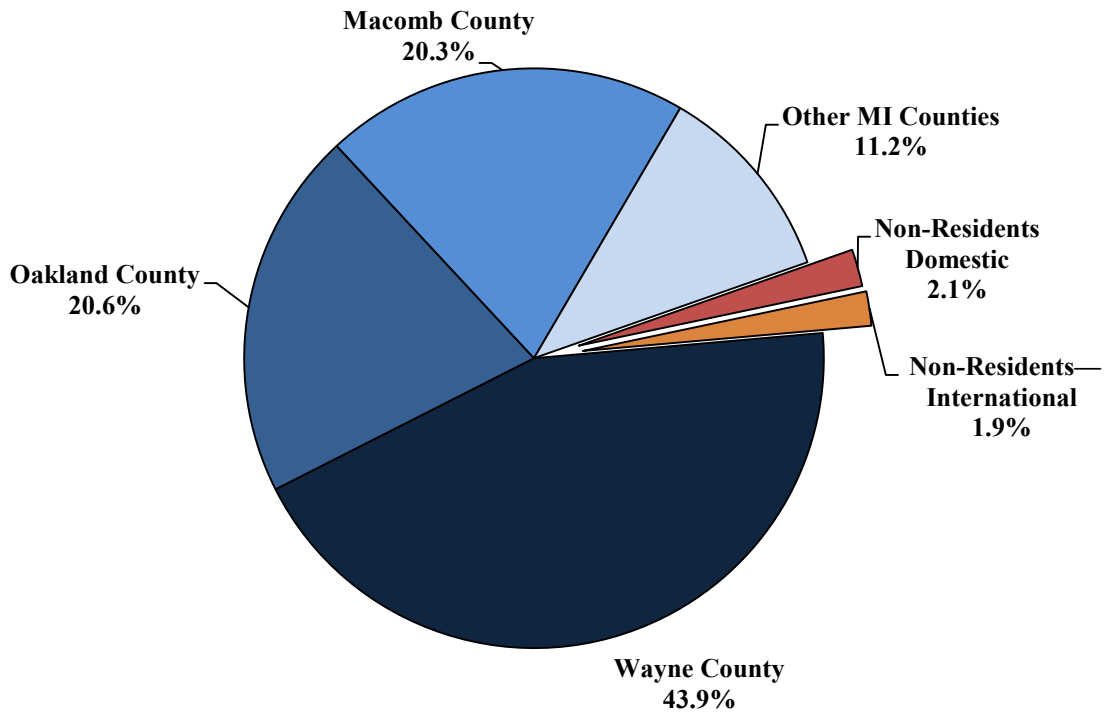

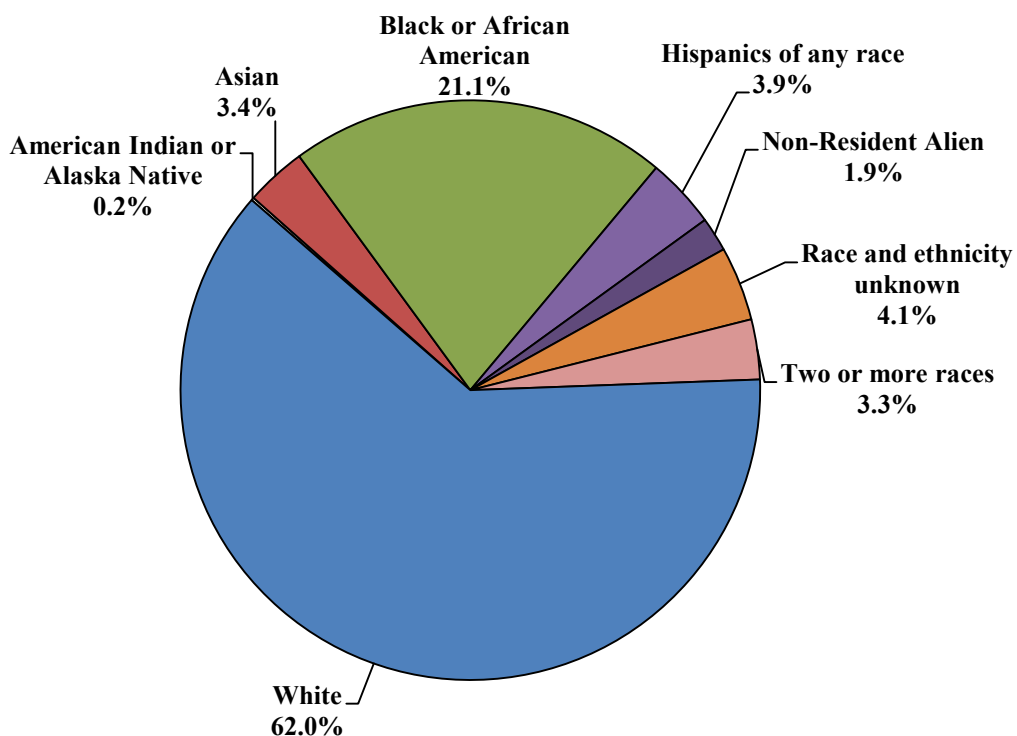

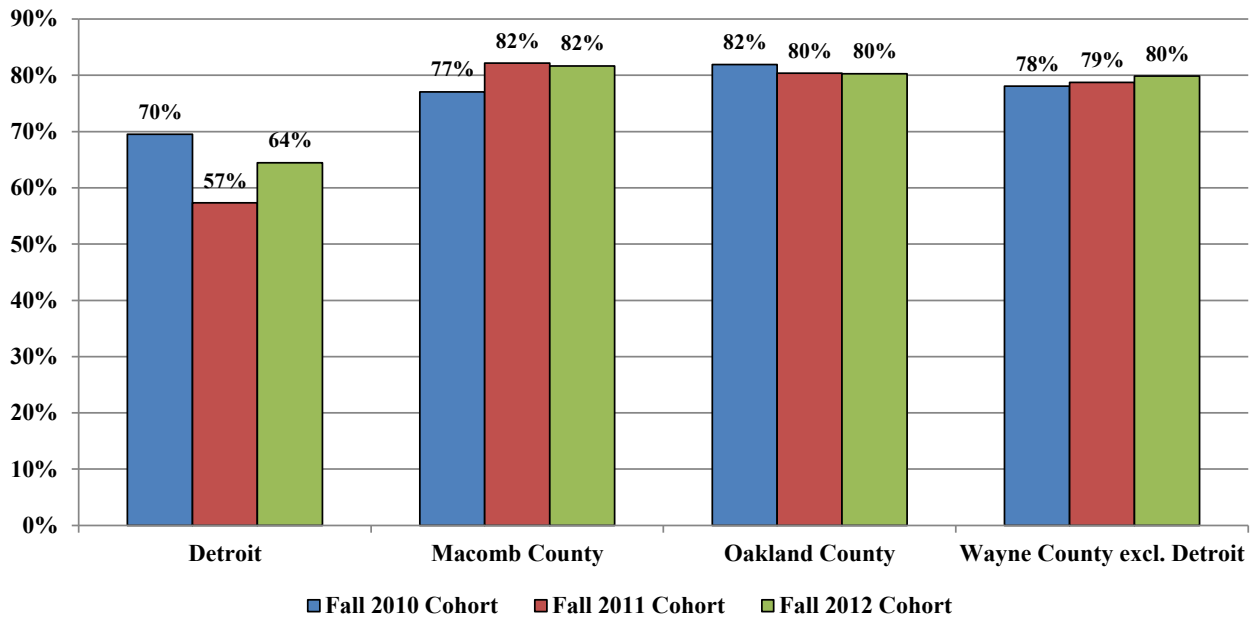
### Fall 2013 Transfer Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

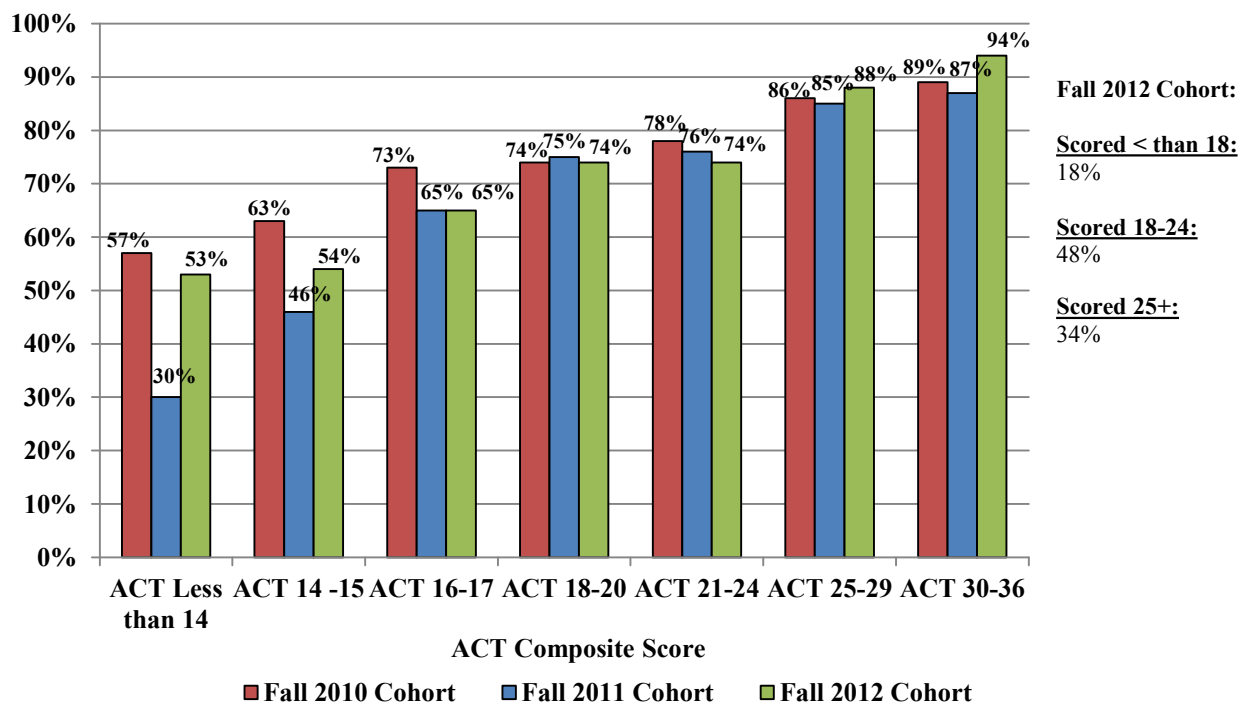


### Tri-County Fall Full-time Freshman One Year Retention



Average Fall 2011 Freshman Cohort One Year Retention—77%

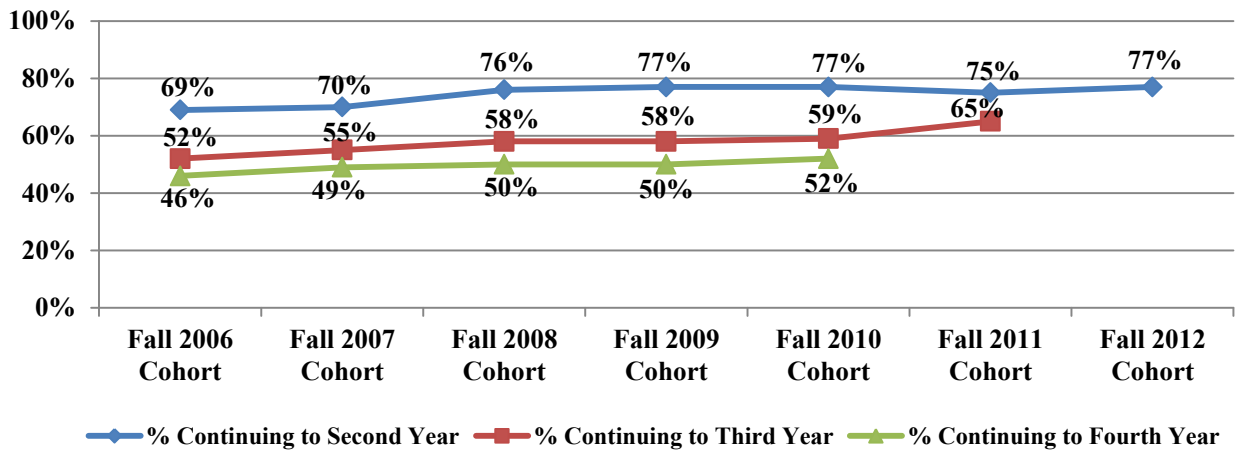
### Fall Full-time Freshman One Year Retention by ACT Composite Score



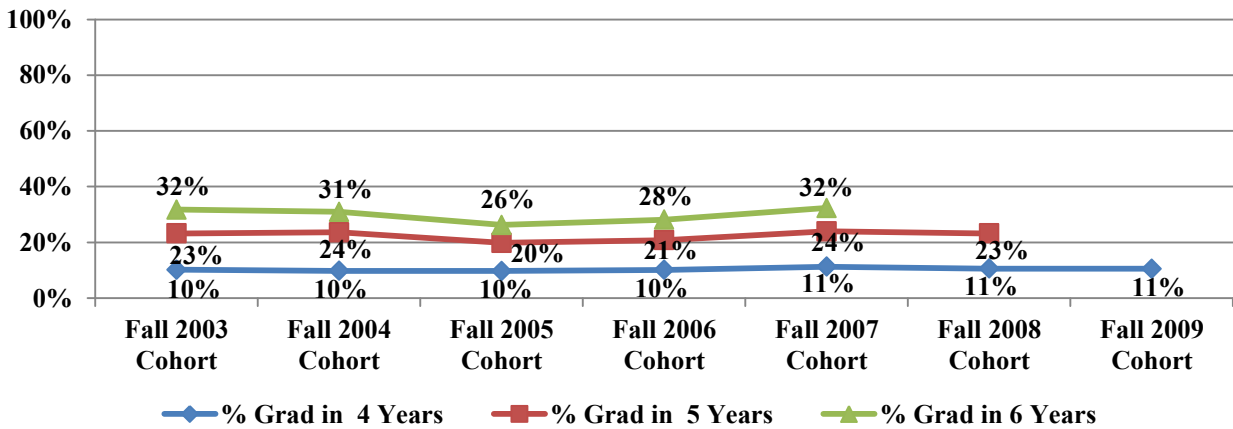

### Fall Full-time Freshmen Multi-Year Graduation Rates



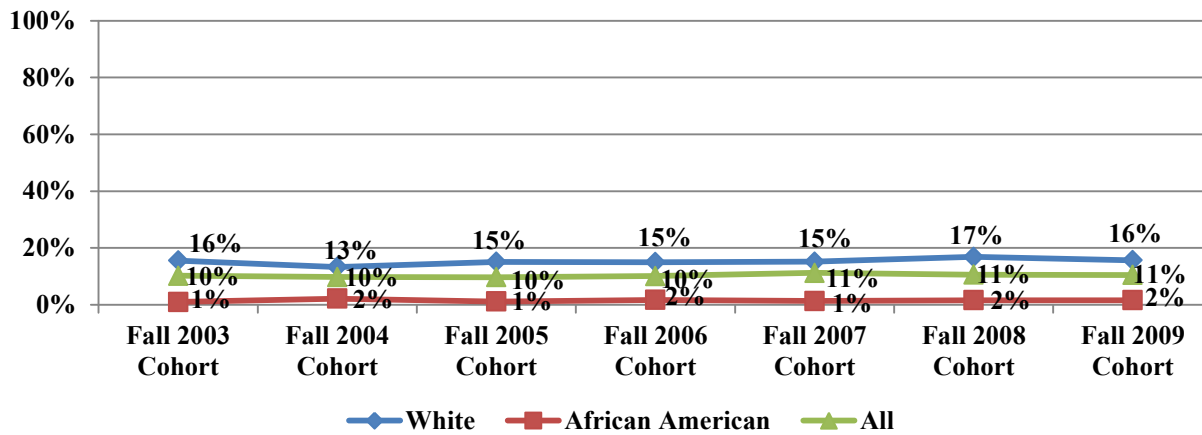

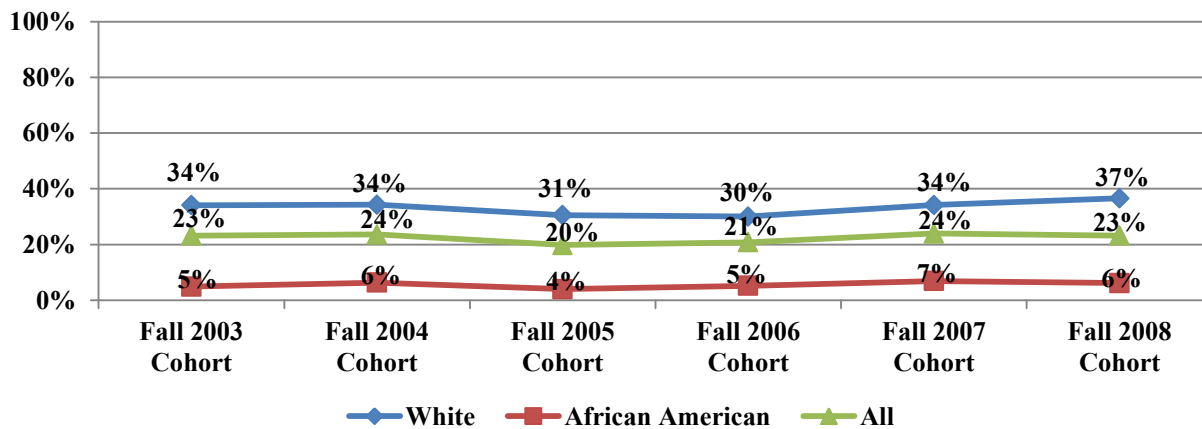

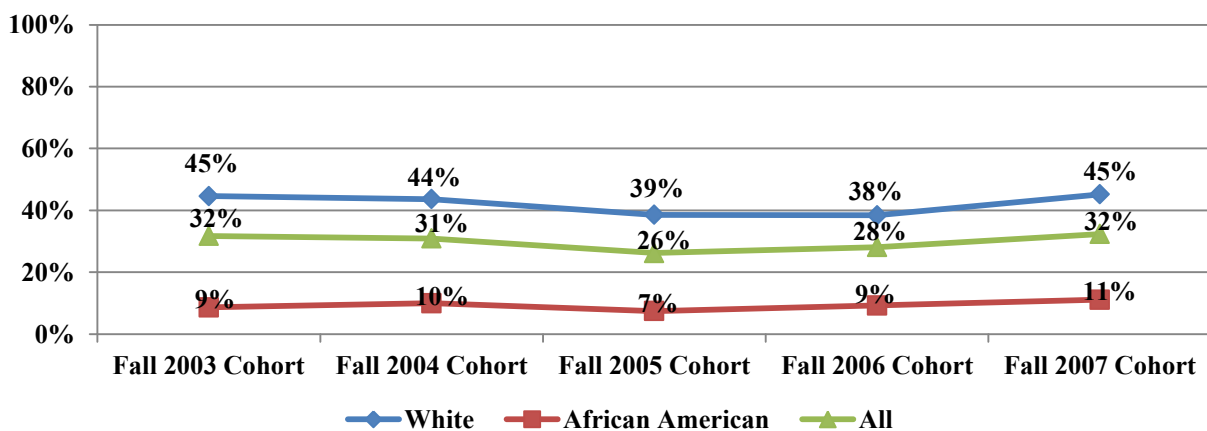
### Fall Full-time Freshmen Four-Year Graduation Rates by Race/Ethnicity

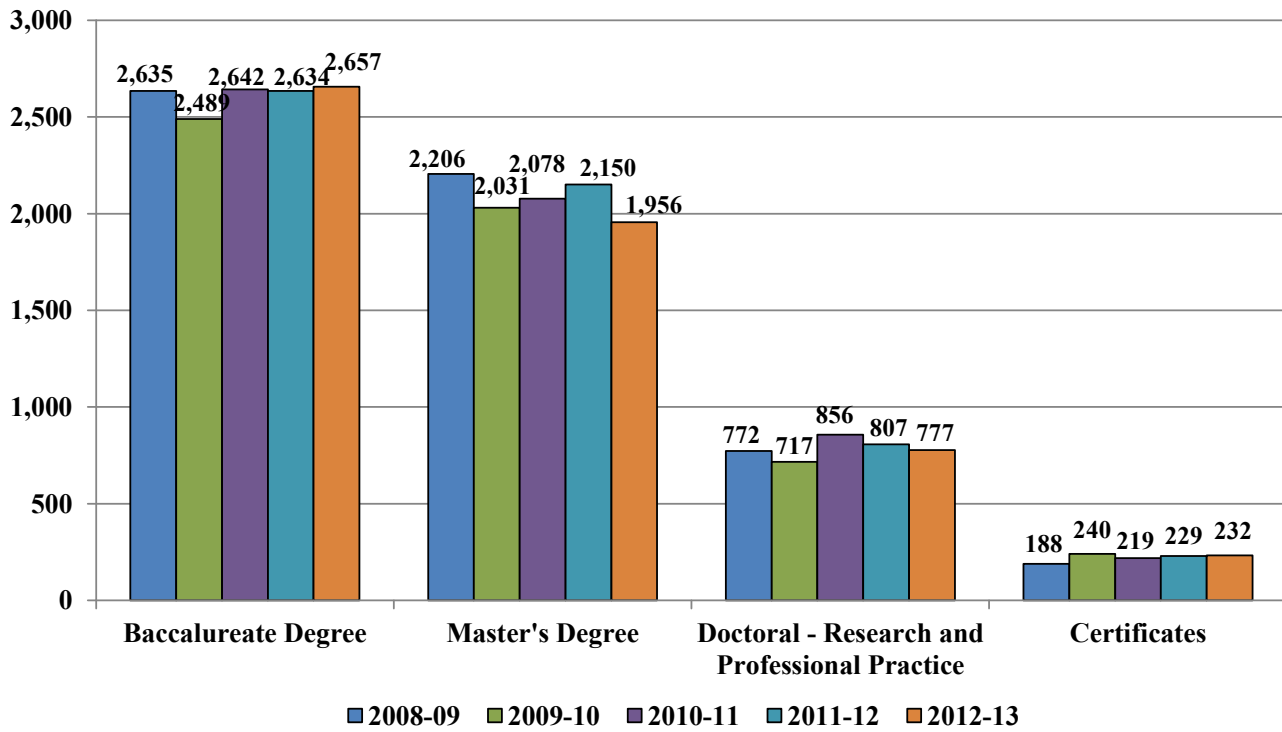

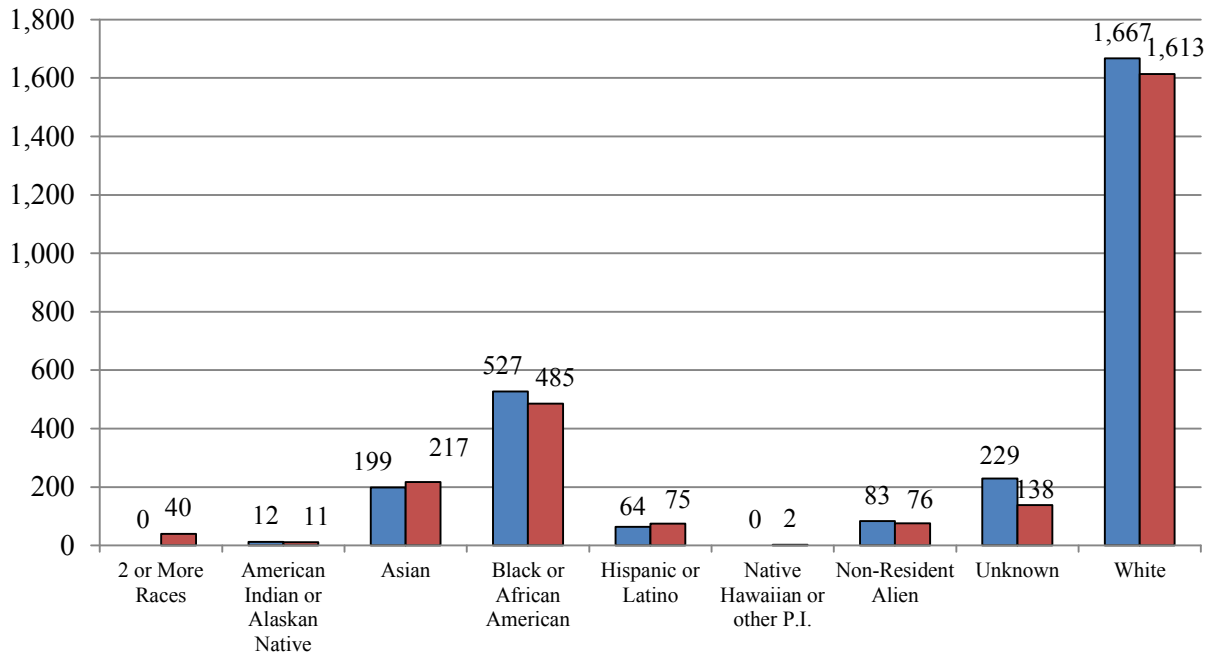
### Number of Degrees and Certificates Granted by Type

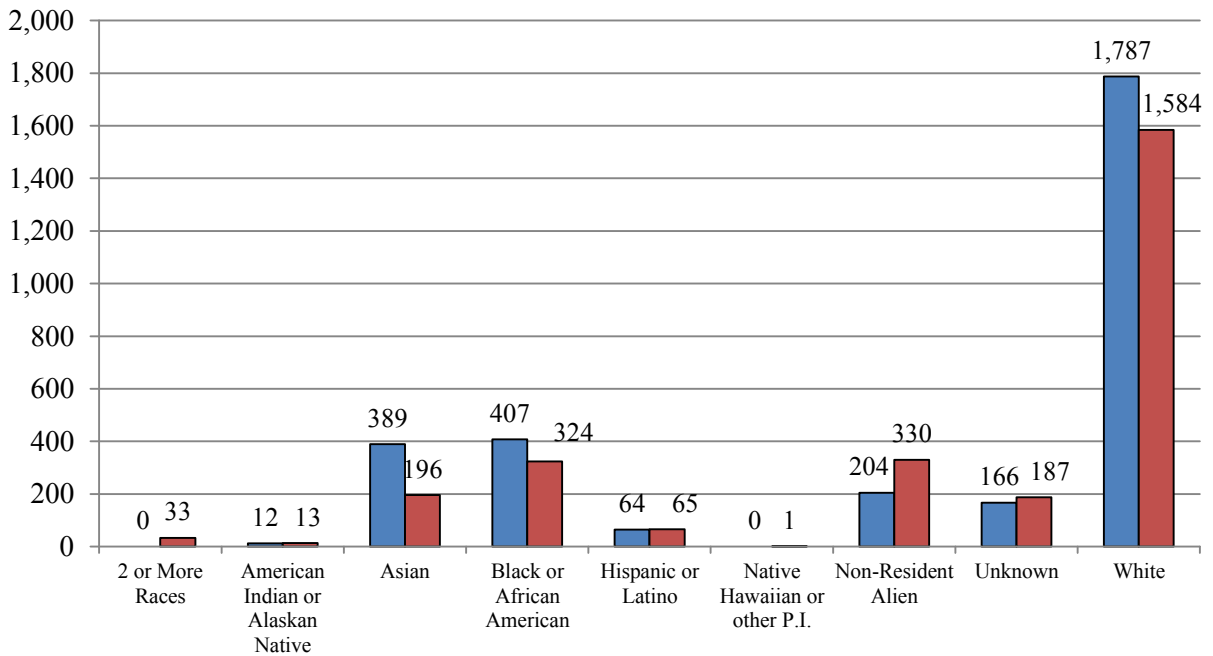
### Undergraduate Degrees Granted by Race/Ethnicity Comparison

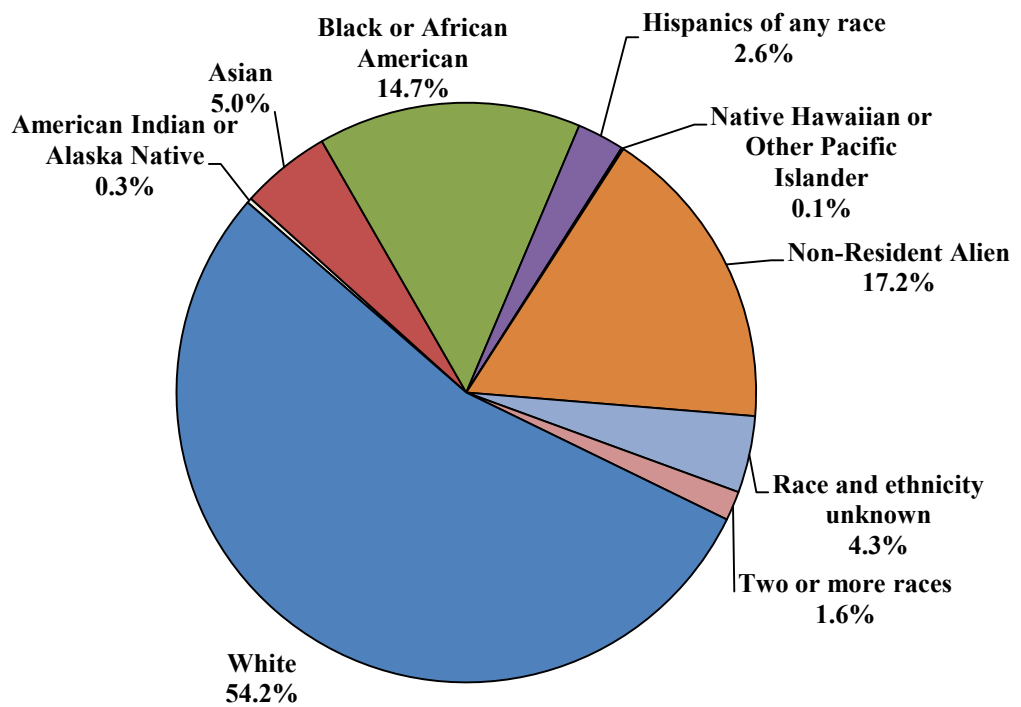

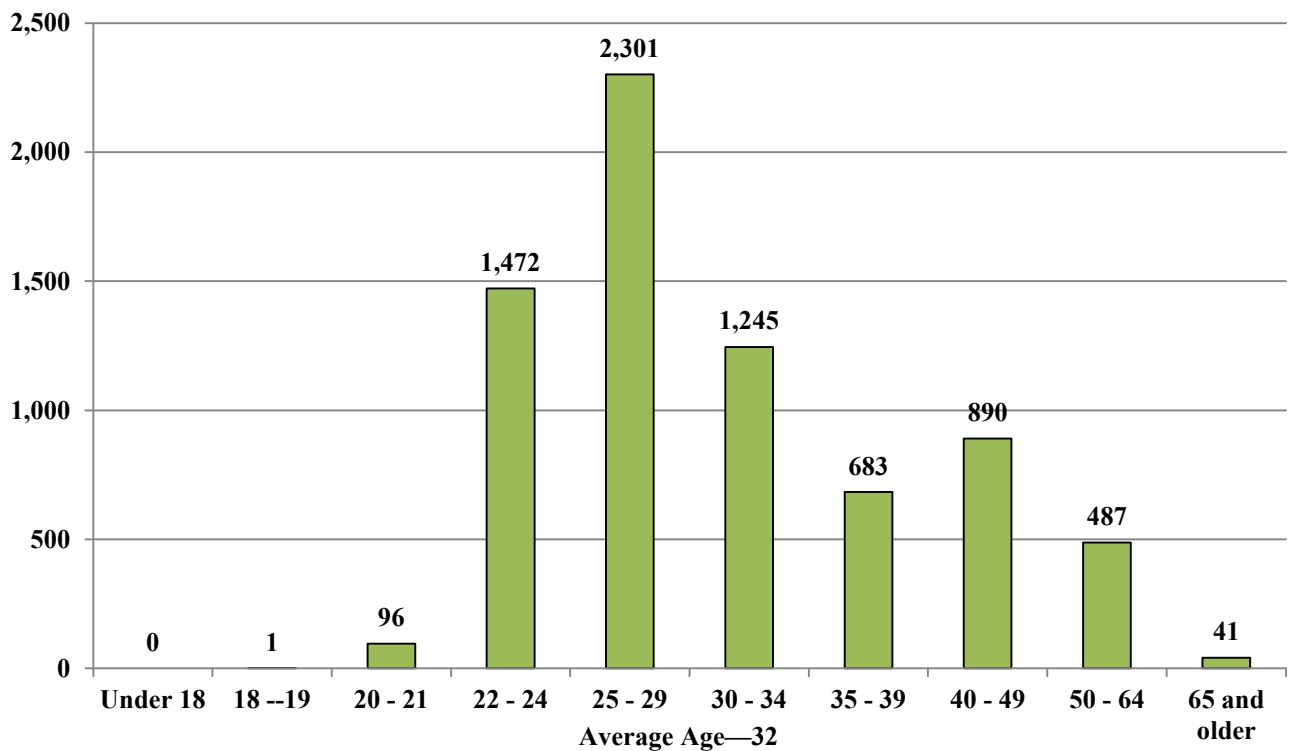

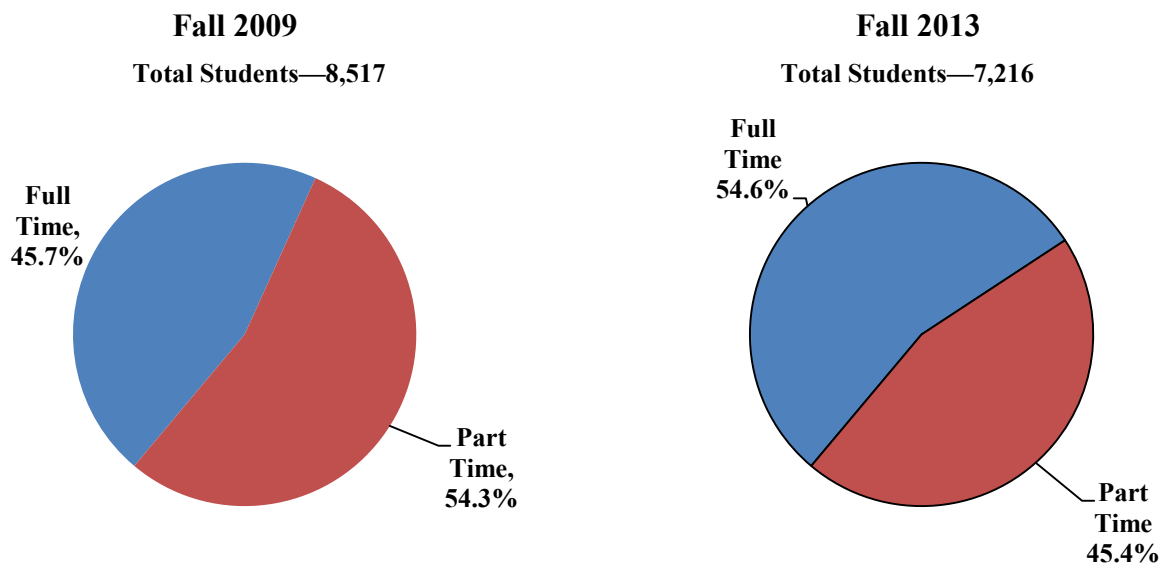
### Fall 2013 Graduate Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity



### Fall 2013 Graduate Enrollment by Age



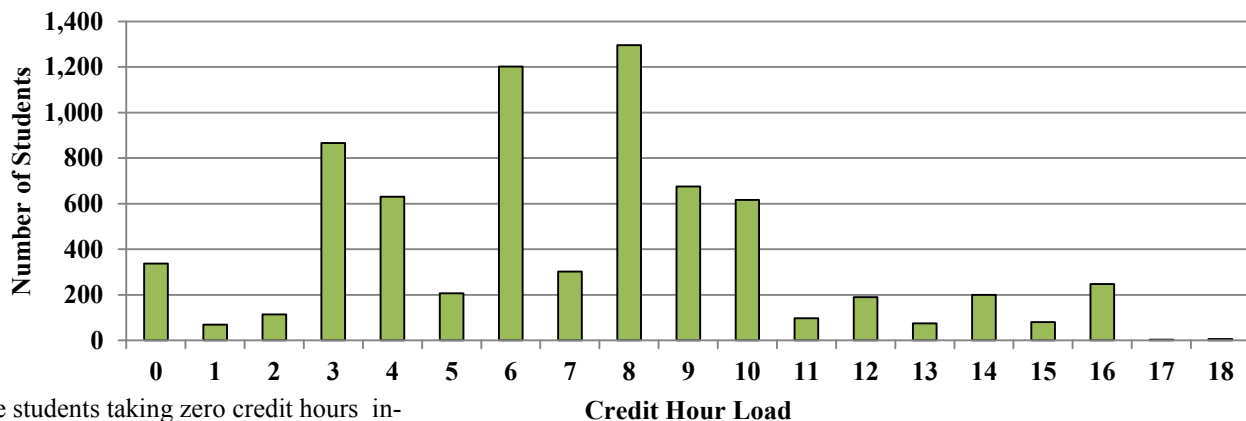
### Fall 2009 to 2013 Graduate Enrollment by Time Status Comparison

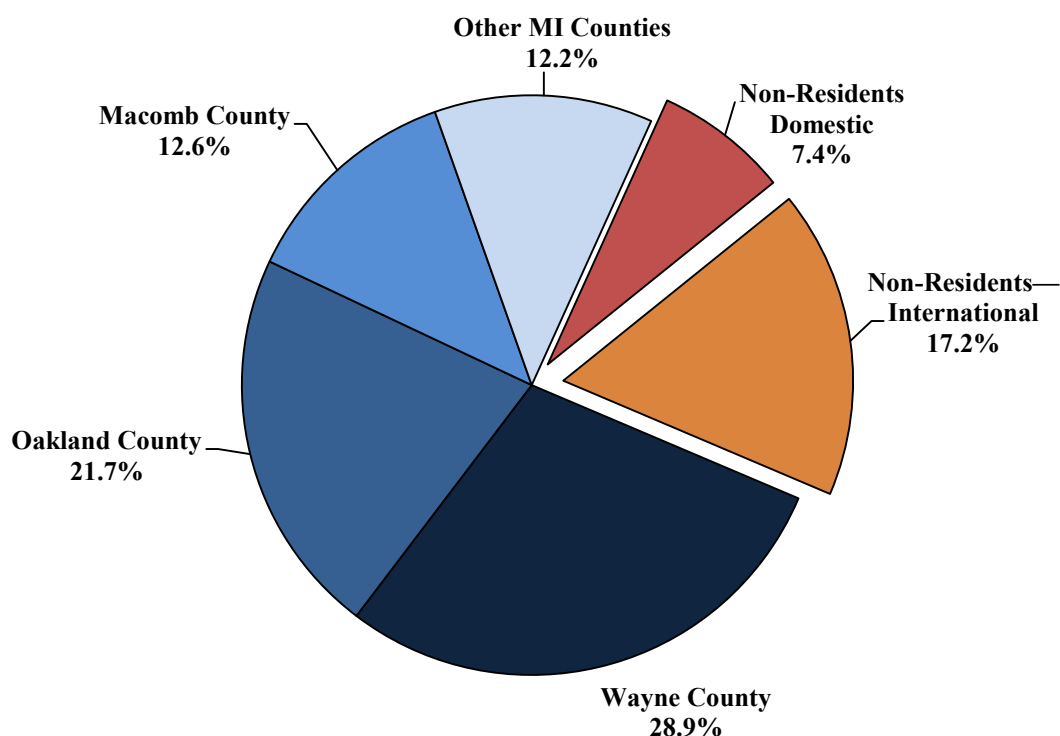
### Fall 2013 Graduate Student Credit Hour Load Distribution

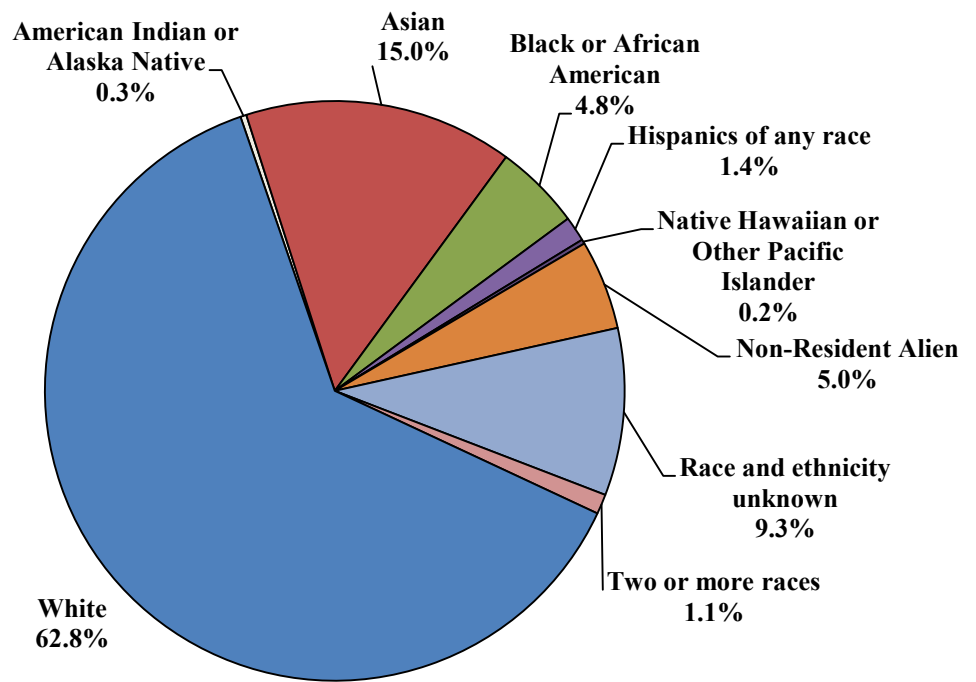

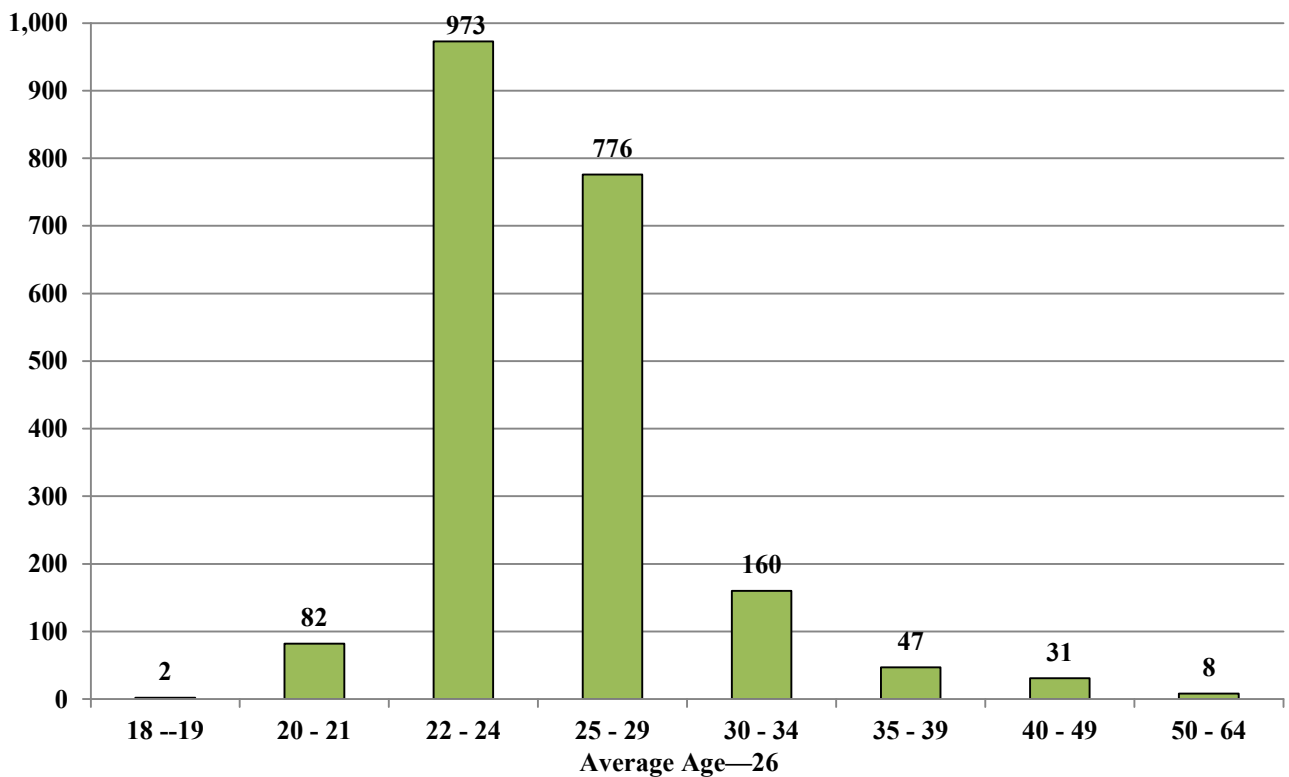

### Fall 2013 Professional Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

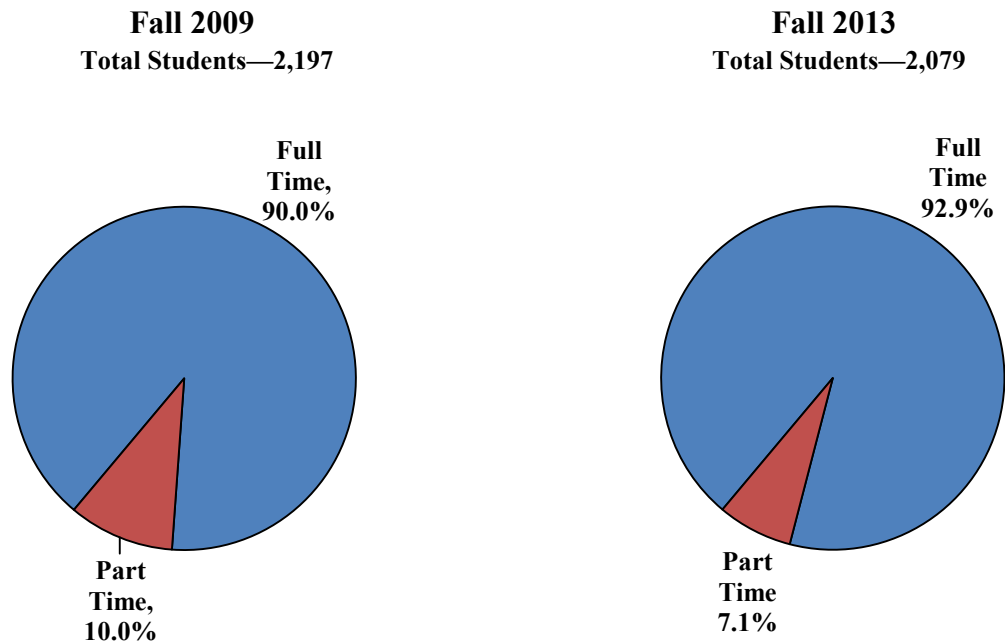


### Fall 2013 Professional Enrollment by Age

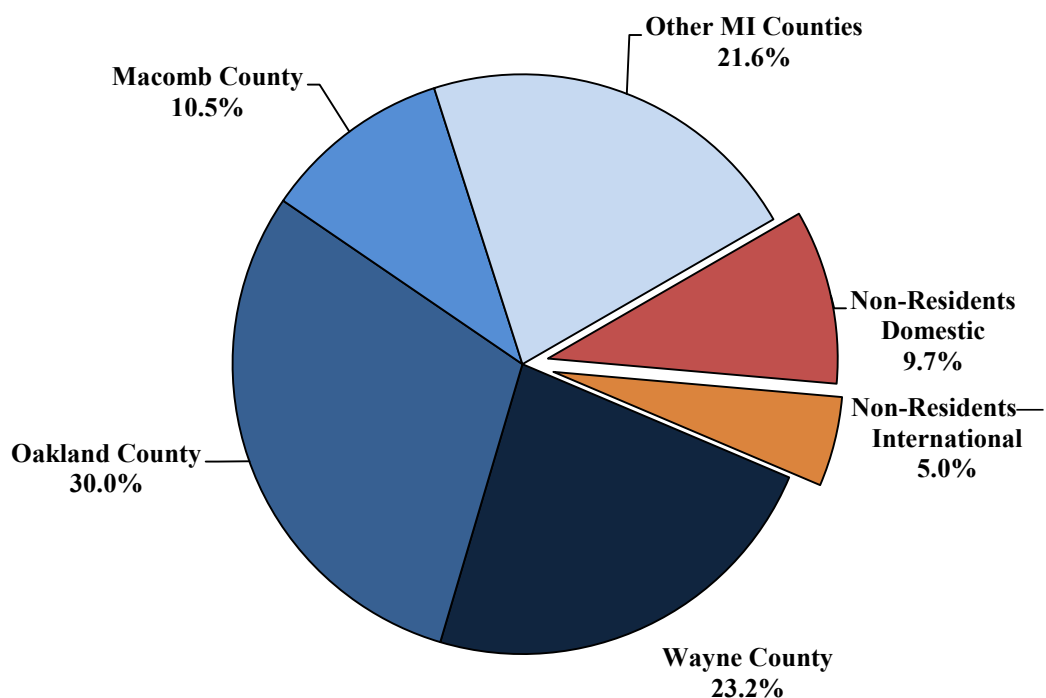
